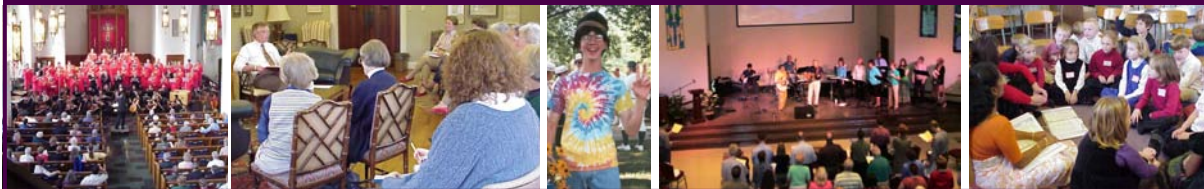

The Knox Picnic is coming up, so be sure to get it on your calendar. **September 26** is the date and **4:00-6:30 pm** is the time, given there is a Bengal's game earlier that afternoon.

This year the picnic will be at Daniel Drake Park, 5700 Red Bank Road in Pleasant Ridge rather than at Lunken, where we have held it the last several years. To get there, take I-71 to the Red Bank exit. At the first light make a right on Duck Creek and another right soon after on to Red Bank Road. Follow that past Seven Hills School, under I-71, and up the hill. You'll see the turnoff for the park on the right.

The cost is \$5 per person or \$20 per family. Please sign up at Lemonade on the Lawn through September 5 and at Coffee Hour September 12 and 19. You can either pay when you sign up or at the park.

The church will provide the barbecue and bottled water. You bring either a side dish, salad or dessert to share. *To keep this event "green," please bring reusable plates, silverware & cups.* A "rinsing station" will be set up, so you can clean these items after you eat. We'll also have a few disposable items for those who forget to bring their own.

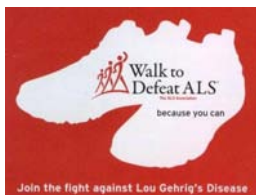


THE WHO, WHAT, WHERE & WHY of SCRIPTURE QUOTATION

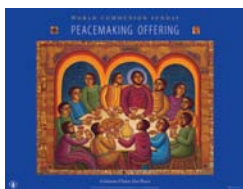

2010 PEACEMAKING OFFERING ...

... is the thirtieth anniversary of the Presbyterian Peacemaking Program and Peacemaking Offering. This year as we make plans to receive this offering, remember the peacemakers

of years past — in our congregation, presbytery, synod and the denomination as a whole. Make this year a time to renew your commitment to peacemaking as part of your calling as a follower of Christ, who not only taught us the ways of peace but is our peace.

The theme for the 2010 Offering is "Celebrate Christ, Our Peace." The art is *The Last Supper*, a serigraph by John August Swanson.

The Peacemaking Offering was created in 1980 to support the efforts of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) to live out a deeper commitment to peacemaking as part of our faithfulness to God. It is one of four special offerings designated by the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.)'s General Assembly. Most churches receive the Offering on World Communion Sunday, the first Sunday in October, which this year is October 3. Knox, too, will be receiving this offering on that **October 3rd** Sunday.

The PCUSA encourages each congregation to retain 25 percent of the Offering it receives to use for local ministries of peacemaking within the church and its community. Twenty-five percent is used by presbyteries and synods, and 50 percent is used by the General Assembly ministries through the Presbyterian Peacemaking Program.

**A Big Thank You! ...
... from the Knox Stewardship Committee**

For the past number of years, Knox has been in somewhat of a state of transition. Our decision to add new space to the building, and to undertake much needed renovations in the existing building meant taking on a substantial amount of debt. Of course during this time, the need to maintain income to support our annual budget did not change. At the same time, the country and the world encountered one of the worst financial crises in recent history, one that has affected the lives of millions.

With God's grace, Knox Church rose to face these difficult circumstances. Last year, we ran a duel campaign – a capital campaign aimed at reducing the capital debt and thereby reducing our interest payments, and the annual pledge campaign in support of our operating budget and ministries. The capital campaign was a great success! Though our debt has not been erased, we have clearly made a substantial dent in it. While the pledge campaign ended further from the goal than we hoped, we were able to create a workable budget that thankfully didn't require the elimination of staff.

The commitment shown last year was truly exceptional. The depth of our pledged commitment to the work of God touched the lives of many in our congregation, our community and in the world. Thank you to all for celebrating God's grace and helping make Knox the place that it is today.

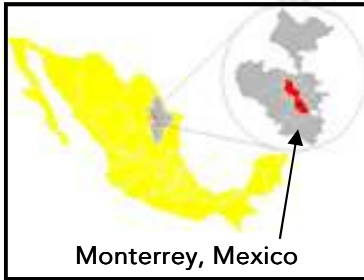

Knox On Mission to Mexico!

From June 26-July 2, Knox members Jeff Kersey, Anna Kuertz, and Terry & Hannah Sexmith were in Monterrey, Mexico with Back2Back Ministries serving and walking alongside local churches and children who reside at Casa Hogar Christian Children's homes.

The children come to the homes for a variety of reasons: neglect, abuse, abandonment, and in some cases, economic inability of the parents to provide for them.

Back2Back Ministries is a ministry based in Mason, OH, currently serving ten children's homes, three poverty stricken areas (squatter communities) and three churches



in Monterrey. Each children's home has 25 to 100 children ranging in ages from 10 months to 17 years. B2B exists to love and care for orphans & impoverished children by meeting their physical, spiritual, educational, social & emotional needs that they may overcome their life circumstances and break free from the cycle of generational poverty.

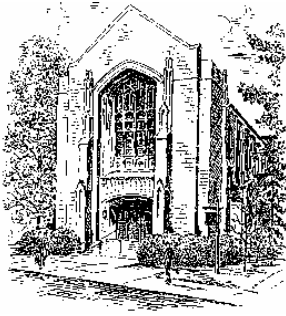

Missions

Ministries and Missions at Knox

Many of you are involved in the work of the church and are aware of the rewards in doing so. But I wonder how many are aware of the BIG picture. There is so much ministry and mission happen-

ing as a result of the efforts and financial support of so many here at Knox.

Did you know that our Mission and Social Concern budget is \$125,000 this year with \$55,000 for the designated mission treasury of the Presbytery and the rest for local benevolences? There are many congregation members devoting time and effort to help our mission partners as well. It is something to be proud of!

We currently have 18 mission partners. Each has a church member liaison who is a member of the Mission & Social Concern Committee who helps to determine how Knox can best help the mission partner and bring requests for assistance to the congregation. They also monitor and recommend changes in Knox's contributions or participation with the mission partner.

There are many opportunities to get involved with our mission partners. You will soon be hearing about our second annual

"Mission Possible" event which is an opportunity to learn more and to visit our partners "on sight" to help out. Last year, it was said by many that "the energy in the room" when and where we all gathered before and after the main event "was wonderful to experience." I hope you will participate and experience it for yourself.

We will be serving a select few of our many mission partners that day. I would like to contribute to your view of the BIG Picture of Knox's ministry by sharing a list of all the mission partners we currently support financially and with time, skills and effort.

Knox Mission Partners
